August 7, 2022 19th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Our readings today explore how faith begins and how faith works. Faith begins with God's initiative of love, together with God's promise about the future. The passage from Hebrews urges readers to have an assured confidence in God, who promised and delivered a lasting legacy to Abraham. The book of Wisdom reminds readers of the God who promised and delivered freedom from slavery during the Exodus. In the Gospel passage from Luke, Jesus begins with the promise that "your Father is pleased to give you the Kingdom," before describing how to live faithfully during times when God seems absent. God's promises mean that God is fully invested in our future. Living in these promises, we can confidently let go of fear and insecurity. 2022-2023 Codes of Conduct are available

As we do every fiscal year, the 2022-2023 Code of Conduct has been made available (in English, Spanish and Vietnamese) through the diocesan webpage under Ministries/Offices, Child and Youth Protection https://dioscg.org/child-youth-protection/.

All diocesan personnel, which includes clergy, diocesan, parish and school employees and volunteers who regularly engage in activities involving minors or vulnerable adults are to receive the full five-page document, required to read, sign, and submit the signature page (page five) of the current Code of Conduct to the local Safe Environment Coordinator which is then to be immediately forwarded to the Office of Child and Youth Protection. In addition, diocesan personnel, if they have not already done so, are also required to have had a background screening and have completed the Safe Environment (VIRTUS) training. This year, the Mandated and Ethical Reporter Training has been added as part of the required training for new employees and volunteers and is available upon request for all others.

The Code of Conduct is required every year as part of the ongoing training as suggested under the Charter and required in our diocesan Safe Environment Policy and Procedures. There are often changes and revisions that are made to the Code of Conduct in order to remain current with more recent recommendations of the USCCB and the Vatican, or as a result of recently reported concerns.

Please, as always, read the entire Code of Conduct and especially note the changes in what is described as appropriate or inappropriate contact, and the I will and the I will not sections. Our effort in this mission and ministry is to create a safe environment for all and as is noted in the Code of Conduct:

The Diocese of Springfield – Cape Girardeau has established a policy to promote a positive, nurturing, and safe environment for all ministries to protect minors and adults, as well as diocesan personnel, from misconduct or misunderstandings. This and related policies and guidelines are to be carefully followed by all diocesan personnel.

Thank you for all you do to support this mission and ministry and to protect children and the most vulnerable. We literally could not do this without you! Please contact the Office of Child and Youth Protection if you have any questions or comments about this 2022-2023 Code of Conduct.

I also want to take this opportunity to share that Rosie Francka, a long-time advocate for the protection of children and my assistant, guide, and friend these past five years, is retiring in October. Rosie has been wonderful in working directly with most of you and answering many of your questions. I am so grateful for her and the work she has done, and can only hope and pray we will find someone who can do what Rosie has done for the children and the vulnerable adults in our diocese.
