This week, I reflected quite a bit on the solemnity of the Holy Trinity, but not in the way you may think. I reflected on the second reading from **2 Corinthians 13:11-12** *Brothers and sisters, rejoice. Mend your ways, encourage one another, agree with one another, live in peace, and the God of love and peace will be with you. Greet one another with a holy kiss. All the holy ones greet you. The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ and the love of God and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with you all.*

When Jesus appears to his disciples in a locked room, as described in both Luke and John, he greets them by saying, "Peace be with you." This greeting carries much deeper meaning than a simple "Shalom" or casual hello—it conveys His unique, divine peace. After the ordeal of the crucifixion, Jesus uses these words to calm lingering anxieties and heal feelings of betrayal among his followers. His greeting acts as a profound prayer, offering forgiveness and reassurance. Instead of reproaching his disciples during this extraordinary appearance, Jesus chooses to forgive them, showing his wounds as a symbol of love and compassion—an embodiment of true peace.

At each Mass during the Liturgy of the Eucharist, following the Lord's Prayer, the congregation collectively recites, "Our Father who art in heaven...". Upon completion of the doxology, the Priest or Deacon formally invites the assembly with the words, "Let us offer each other the sign of peace." The sign of peace, sometimes referred to as the Kiss of Peace, is then exchanged with those in whom we are near, by offering an embrace, a bow, or a handshake.

This is not simply a greeting; it represents a deep gesture. In embracing one another, we are seeking forgiveness from each other, begging if you will, before we receive Christ, body, blood, soul, and divinity in the Holy Eucharist.

During the upcoming Mass, you might choose to participate in the Kiss of Peace as a sincere gesture of love, reconciliation, and profound forgiveness—reflecting the example Jesus set for his disciples. This practice offers an opportunity to connect authentically with those around you, transforming a conventional greeting into a meaningful moment of genuine love.

Esta semana, reflexione bastante sobre la solemnidad de la Santísima Trinidad, pero no de la manera en que quizás piensen. Reflexione sobre la segunda lectura, tomada de **2 Corintios 13:11-12**: ***“Hermanos y hermanas, alégrense. Enmienden sus caminos, animense mutuamente, vivan en armonía, vivan en paz, y el Dios del amor y de la paz estará con ustedes. Salúdense unos a otros con un beso santo. Todos los santos los saludan. La gracia del señor Jesucristo, el amor de Dios y la comunión del Espíritu Santo estén con todos ustedes.”***

Cuando Jesús se aparece a sus discípulos en una habitación cerrado con llave—tal como se describe tanto en Lucas como en Juan—los saluda diciendo: “La paz este con ustedes.” Este saludo encierra un significado mucho mas profundo que un simple “Shalom” o un “hola” casual; transmite Su paz única y divina. Tras el calvario de la crucifixión, Jesús utiliza esta palabra [ara calmar las ansiedades persistentes y sanar los sentimientos de traición entre sus seguidores. Su saludo actúa como una oración profunda, ofreciendo perdón y consuelo. En lugar de reprochar a sus discípulos durante esta extraordinaria aparición, Jesús elige perdonarlos, mostrándoles sus heridas como símbolo de amor y compasión: una encarnación de la verdadera paz.

En cada Misa, durante la Liturgia de la Eucaristía y tras el Padre Nuestro, la congregación recita colectivamente: “Padre nuestro, que estas en el cielo...” Al concluir la doxología, el sacerdote o el diacono invita formalmente a la asamblea con estas palabras: “Daos fraternalmente la paz.” A continuación, se intercambia el signo de la paz—a veces denominado “Beso de la Paz”—con las personas que tenemos cerca, ofreciendo un abrazo, una reverencia o un apretón de manos. Este acto no es un simple saludo; representa un gesto de gran profundidad. Al abrazarnos mutuamente, buscamos el perdón de los demás—implorándolo, si se quiere—antes de recibir a Cristo: cuerpo, sangre, alma y divinidad en la Sagrada Eucaristía.

Durante la próxima Misa, puedes optar por participar en el beso de la Paz como un gesto sincero de amor, reconciliación y profundo perdón, reflejando el ejemplo que Jesus dio a sus discípulos. Esta practica ofrece la oportunidad de conectar auténticamente con quienes te rodean, transformando un saludo convencional en un momento significativo de amor genuino.
