Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence. For members of the Latin Catholic Church, the norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. The norms for concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Latin Catholic Church from age 14 onwards.

Ayuno y Abstinencia Cuaresmal

Genuflecting

Genuflecting Before the Blessed Sacrament –Bowing before the Altar Once we a Catholic church proper we walk to our pew and genuflect to the Blessed Sacrament in the tabernacle. If the Blessed Sacrament is reserved in a Blessed Sacrament chapel, we would then bow deeply to the altar as the altar represents Christ. Bowing and genuflecting are gestures of greeting and submission. Bowing is a lesser form of reverence than genuflecting. Let's look at the difference between these two signs. There's a traditional distinction that's very useful: a distinction using three Greek words: latria, hyperdulia, dulia. These three categories indicate different grades of reverence due to God and the saints. Latria means adoration: it is reserved to God alone. Hyperdulia means "extra special reverence". There is only one person in this category: Mary the Mother of God, since she is above all the saints by the glorious design of God. Dulia means reverence; it is given to the saints and to sacred objects. Latria, hyperdulia, dulia. When we reverence the altar – and the altar always represents Christ, we are showing honor to a sacred object. That means dulia. So we bow. When we reverence the Blessed Sacrament, however, we are adoring God Himself, since the Lord is truly present in the Blessed Sacrament. That means latria. So we genuflect. Let's take a look at both bows and genuflecting. There are two kinds of bows in use today. First, there is the bow of the head (or simple bow) this bow is a slow nod. It is made when the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit and named together and at the name of Jesus, Mary, or the saint in whose honor the Mass is celebrated (GIRM §275a). Reverence for the Holy Name of Our Lord, Jesus Christ, arose in the apostolic times. St. Paul in his Letter to the Philippians wrote, "So that at Jesus' name every knee must bend in the heavens, on the earth and under the earth, and every tongue proclaim to the glory of God the Father: Jesus Christ is Lord" (2:10-11). Secondly, there is the deep or profound bow, bending the entire body at the waist, touching the knees with the palms of the hand. This bow is the normal method of expressing reverence and respect throughout the church. It is made when the deacon asks the priest for a blessing before he reads the Gospel. Whenever we pass in front of the altar, when the Blessed Sacrament is not present, we are to bow deeply. The priest also demonstrates the profound bow when he presses his lips to the altar before Mass begins; this kiss is for our Lord. He thereby expresses his love, and asks for His in return. We also bow deeply when we recite the words of the profession of faith, which refer to the incarnation: "by the power of the Holy Spirit he was born of the Virgin Mary and became man." All kneel at these words on the solemnities of Christmas and Annunciation (GIRM §275b).

Genuflecting the word "genuflexion" comes from two Latin words: genu, knee; flectere, to bend. It is a natural sign of adoration or reverence. A genuflexion is not a curtsy. It is the momentary bending of the right knee to touch the floor; the body should be held erect and the sign of the Cross not made. It is frequently used in the ritual of the Church. All genuflect when passing before an altar at which the Blessed Sacrament is reserved, or is lying upon the corporal during Mass, and to the unveiled cross from the solemn adoration in the liturgy of Good Friday until the beginning of the Easter Vigil. The priest repeatedly genuflects during Mass in adoration of the Eucharist after the consecration. Since a genuflection is an act of adoration, the general liturgical norms no longer make any distinction between the manners of adoring Christ reserved in the tabernacle or exposed, upon the altar, in a monstrance. The simple single genuflection on one knee may be used in all cases. Some bishops' conferences have voted to retain the use of the double genuflection for the Blessed Sacrament exposed, and it would be required in these countries. In this case, those who make the double genuflection kneel briefly on both knees and reverently incline the head with hands joined together palm to palm with the right thumb crossed over the left, and held at the breast. The 2002 GIRM specifies that: "If there is a tabernacle with the Blessed Sacrament in the sanctuary, the priest, deacon and other ministers [e.g. altar servers] genuflect to it when they approach or leave the altar [beginning and end of Mass], but not during the celebration of Mass itself. Otherwise, all who cross before the most Blessed Sacrament genuflect [e.g. ushers], unless they are involved in a procession. "Three genuflections are made during Mass by the priest celebrant: after the showing of the Eucharistic bread, after the showing of the chalice, and before communion. If there is a tabernacle with the Blessed Sacrament in the sanctuary, a genuflection is made before and after Mass and whenever anyone passes in front of the Blessed Sacrament" (§274).
