Brothers and sisters in Christ,

Today we celebrate Pentecost—the day when the Holy Spirit rushed upon the disciples like wind and fire, transforming ordinary men and women into bold witnesses of the risen Lord. The same Spirit who descended upon the early Church has been poured into our hearts. He has not changed. His power has not diminished. His gifts have not weakened with time.

For those of us who have been confirmed, Pentecost is not simply a memory. It is a reminder of our identity and our mission. In Confirmation, the Church prayed that the Spirit would strengthen us with His seven gifts—wisdom, understanding, counsel, fortitude, knowledge, piety, and fear of the Lord—so that we might stand in the world as people who proclaim with our lives and our voices that Jesus Christ is Lord.

These gifts are not decorations. They are tools for mission.

They are not meant to be hidden. They are meant to be used.

They are not given for our comfort. They are given for our courage.

The Spirit gives **Wisdom** so we can see the world through God's eyes.

He gives **Understanding** so we can grasp the truth of the Gospel.

He gives **counsel** so we can choose the good even when the path is unclear.

He gives **Fortitude** so we can stand firm when faith is costly.

He gives **Knowledge** so we can recognize God's work in our lives.

He gives **Piety** so we can love God as children love a Father.

He gives **Fear of the Lord** so we never lose our awe before His holiness.

Pentecost reminds us that the Spirit does not make us timid. He makes us bold.

He does not make us comfortable. He makes us missionaries.

He does not make us silent. He makes us witnesses.

So today, let us ask the Holy Spirit to stir up again the gifts we received at Confirmation and set our hearts on fire for Christ. And we remember Bishop Rice's unmistakable tap on the cheek—a reminder he gives every confirmandi. He tells them, "Come, Holy Spirit," especially in moments when strength and guidance are needed.

That tap is not just symbolic. It tells us plainly that being a bold Catholic Christian will not be an easy ride. It takes courage. It takes conviction. It takes the Spirit alive within us.

Come, Holy Spirit. Renew Your Church. Renew our hearts. And send us out as Your witnesses.

Nos da fortaleza para que podamos mantenernos firmes cuando la fe es costosa.

Nos da conocimiento para que podamos reconocer la obra de Dios en nuestras vidas.

El nos da piedad para que amemos a Dios como los hijos aman a su padre.

El nos da temor del señor para que nunca perdamos la reverencia ante su santidad.

Pentecostés nos recuerda que el espíritu no nos hace tímidos, sino valientes.

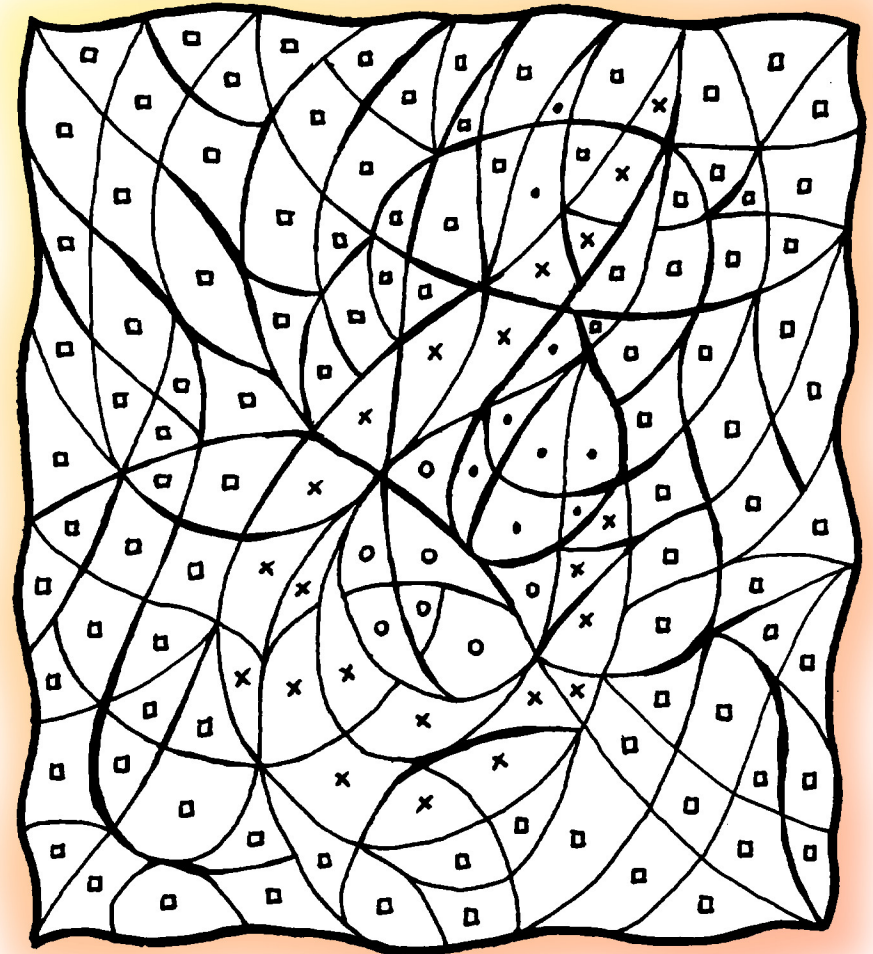
Glory be to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit as it was in the beginning, is now and will be forever! Amen.

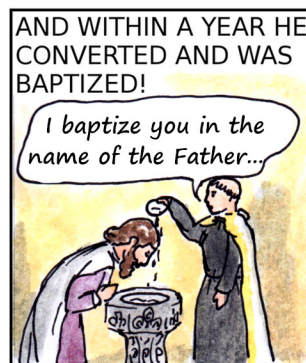
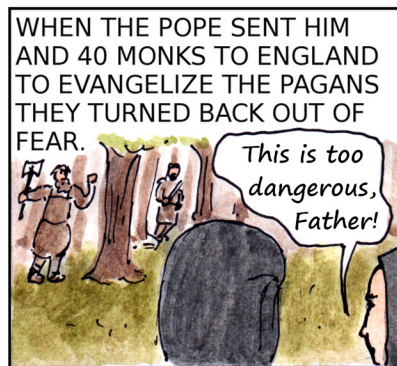
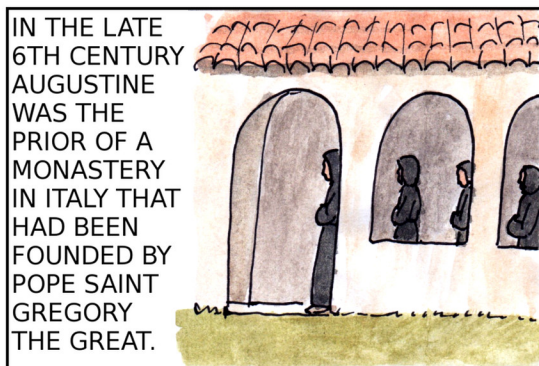
